NORTH OLMSTED FOOD PANTRY/COMMUNITY LIFE SERVICES

Eligibility for assistance through the department requires proven financial need and residency within the City of North Olmsted. The requirements are similar to those of other government assistance programs. To establish proof of residency and financial need, applicants will be asked to present a copy of some of the following documents at registration. These are the 8 most typical of documents required.: Current or recent month's utility bill, Lease agreement, Recent W-2 form or paycheck stub, Social Security Award Letter, Current Unemployment book, Child Support Statements, Photo Identification, Children's birth certificates, Most recent years tax return. Perishable and Nonperishable food is usually distributed every Wednesday. **Appointments must be made** by calling Joanne Hanna, the pantry coordinator at 716-4165.
